## Single Tickets for Mondavi Center Performances to Go On Sale August 31

*August 28, 2009; Davis, California*—Single tickets for the 2009-2010 season at the **Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts** will go on sale Monday, **August 31, 2009**. Tickets are available from the Mondavi Center Ticket Office at 530.754.2787 or online at [MondaviArts.org](http://MondaviArts.org). The Ticket Office will begin selling tickets at noon. The Ticket Office, located at the north end of the Mondavi Center, is open Monday-Friday from noon until 6 pm.

The 2009-2010 season at the Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts includes nearly **85 concerts, lectures, and recitals** by such celebrated performers as **Merle Haggard**, the **Emerson String Quartet**, **Sonny Rollins**, the **Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra**, the **Del McCoury Band**, **Arlo Guthrie**, **Emanuel Ax**, and the **Aspen Santa Fe Ballet**; speakers ranging from political analyst **Arianna Huffington** to National Public Radio producer **Ira Glass**; and such Mondavi Center favorites as **Pilobolus**, the **American Bach Soloists**, **Mariachi Los Camperos de Nati Cano**, the **Chieftains**, **Joshua Bell**, **Cashore Marionettes**, and **Ronald K. Brown/EVIDENCE**.
